Responsibility for safety

The Pastors , Elders and Deacons acknowledge they have the primary legal responsibility for work place health and safety

However it is also the responsibility of employees and voluntary workers to cooperate with the Leadership Team in providing a safe work place and report all identified hazards

Contractors or those providing a service to the Church must also cooperate and abide by Work Place Health and Safety Regulations when working on site.

BDBC will demonstrate its commitment to safety by:

- Providing adequate resources, a safe workplace and safe ways of working
- Consulting staff and volunteers, keeping them involved in decision making that may affect their health and safety
- Ensuring chemicals are stored and used correctly, tools and electrical equipment are fit for use
- Providing safe and hygienic work amenities as well as first aid facilities
- Providing appropriate Work Place Health and Safety information and training for staff
- Maintaining effective incident and emergency response systems
- Investigating all incidents and implement measures to prevent reoccurrence
- Ensuring risk management principles are applied in any high risk activities
- The provision of policies and procedures that detail the care of people, programs and property
- Documenting and keeping Work Place Health and Safety records in compliance with legislative requirements
